Soil, sand, stones, blocks, etc. Massage chairs, etc. Large amounts of waste at one time **Business-generated waste** Special household appliances

Items NOT collected by municipal

Massage chairs, electronic organs, oil heaters Large amounts of waste due to moving, housecleaning, pruning of trees, etc. Waste generated from the business activities of stores, factories, offices, etc.

Air conditioners, televisions (CRT, LCD/plasma), refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, clothes dryers, personal computers

Soil, sand, stones, blocks, concrete, sand for pet use, tatami mats, etc.

★Dispose of them yourself. However, if the amount is small, you can also take them to a municipal refuse disposal facility directly.

★Dispose of them yourself at a municipal refuse disposal facility directly

or ask a city-approved refuse collection company to take the items ★The city will not collect this type of waste. Take appropriate disposal measures.

★You cannot take these items to municipal refuse disposal facilities.

★Take appropriate disposal measures such as contacting the store from which the item was purchased and asking them to dispose of it.

(Similar items not specifically listed in the examples are also included.)
